Friends and the Community

Oftentimes, friends or others in the CCV community will have taken a class in a semester prior to your having taken that class. As long as the book requirement has not changed, it is often cheaper to buy the text in person from another student than it is to purchase it from an "official" distributor. In addition to friends and acquaintances, there is a bulletin board in the hall next to the student lounge on 119 Pearl St. that is devoted to the intra-CCV buying and selling of textbooks. As with buying any textbook, double check to make sure that it is the correct edition of the book before purchasing.
