CCTA provides bus service for Burlington and other towns of Chittenden County including Williston, Winooski, South Burlington, Essex Center, Essex Junction, Shelburne. CCTA also links to Middlebury, Montpelier, and St. Albans. Standard, one-way fare is \$1.25. Bus passes and route information are available online, at the terminal, or by calling the above number.

Parking at CCV

After 5:00 PM on weekdays and on Saturdays from 8:30 AM – 4:30 PM, free student parking is available in the garage on St. Paul Street (below the 119 Pearl Street building). Your valid CCV Student ID is required for entrance. Student parking is provided for CCV related activities only. The garage is closed on Sundays. However, there is no charge to use metered parking spaces on Sundays.

Before 5 PM on weekdays, CCV is unable to offer student parking. However, there are several options in the area including the Burlington Town Center Mall garage (enter from Cherry St.) or the Church St. Marketplace garage (enter from Cherry or Bank St.). Your first two hours are always free in these garages. Metered parking spots are available around CCV Burlington as well. Blue meters can be used for up to two hours (25 cents / 20 minutes).
